Welcome to explore the *Breathtaking* nature destinations

In our area, you will find easily accessible destinations that are open to travelers of all ages and in various life situations. Whether you have a stroller with you or the site needs to be easy to navigate for another reason, our nature destinations include places designed to provide pleasant experiences for everyone.



1 Kauhaneva-Pohjankangas National Park

The challenging accessible trail at Kauhalampi offers 2.6 km of picturesque marshland experience. The birds nesting in the area provide a unique soundscape for every hiker. The site is maintained by Metsähallitus.

2 Susivuori hut and Susiluola (Wolf cave)

This destination is a historical wonder. The estimated age of Susiluola is about 2.6 million years, and it is likely that Neanderthals once inhabited the cave. The area around Susivuori's hut and the front of the cave is easy to navigate, but the path to the observation tower is rocky. There is an accessible toilet next to the hut. The site is maintained by the municipality of Karijoki.



3 Kangasjärvi

Kangasjärvi is an exceptionally clear and cool-water lake in Isojoki, near Lauhanvuori. The Kangasjärvi area is mainly easy and flat, but a steep paved hill leads from the parking area to the lakeshore. The lakeshore area is managed by the municipality of Isojoki, but the campsite is maintained by a local entrepreneur. Accessible parking is located next to the main building. The campsite offers a wide range of services during the summer.

4 Luonto-Parra

The diverse area of Parra offers plenty to see and do. For example, you can easily drive to the Parra lean-to-shelter, from where you can admire one of Parra's many stone fields. The area around Parra's main building, swimming ponds, and forest church is also flat and easy to navigate. The facilities of a local tourism entrepreneur also include an accessible toilet.

5 Jyllinkoski

The rapids of Jyllinkoski historical power plant area and the beautiful park area are worth of seeing. The yard and the ground floor of the museum buildings are easily accessible. You can admire the dam by walking over the bridge and turning right on to the family path. Jyllinkoski also hosts events such as summer concerts. The area of Jyllinkoski is managed by the city of Kurikka and the museums of Information Technology and the Electricity is managed by Informaatiotekniikan Museoyhdistys ry.
